Refreshments and hot food will be available for purchase on the night.

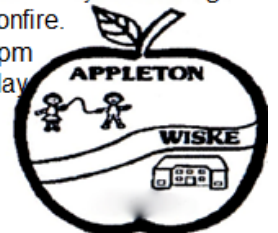

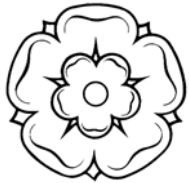

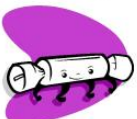

APPLETON WISKE PRIMARY SCHOOL

At the beginning of September we welcomed thirteen new children into our Reception class, one child into Year one and one child into Year six. The autumn term theme for learning has been farming and food. The whole school enjoyed a food festival in September making apple juice, butter and sampling ice cream and food from another continent at the Balti Bistro. Rev. Michael Webster spoke to the children about the Foodshare project in Northallerton and asked if they could help by donating tinned food to the project.

Class one have visited Big Sheep, Little Cow in Bedale along with children from Pre-School. We were also lucky to have a visit by Roger Key, entomologist, and his wife Rosy, who took Class one, Pre School and Yvonne Robinson and a group of children she child minds on a bug hunt at the tennis courts. Class one have also held their regular parents information session on how to support early reading at home. Class two and Class one took part in the Key Stage One fun run and Sadie Robinson and Beth Luck were awarded individual medals. Class one and Pre-school have been to see the "Princess and the Pea" at the Forum in Northallerton. Class three have been studying the Saxons in history and they will be visiting Bede's World in Jarrow at the end of this month to find out how Saxons lived and farmed in 700 AD. Class two will be visiting Fountains Abbey for a felting workshop and a learning walk to support their history theme.

Parents, staff and governors attended an evening presentation by NYCC on identifying and dealing with bullying. The workshop explored questions such as "What is bullying?" and strategies that are used in school to explore relationships and the theme of "Getting on and Falling out" with the children. The school held a successful Macmillan coffee morning which raised £87.16 when the friends of the school provided the refreshments and the children provided the entertainment. Each Friday, the school holds a celebration assembly at 2:50 p.m. You are very welcome to come along and celebrate with the children.
