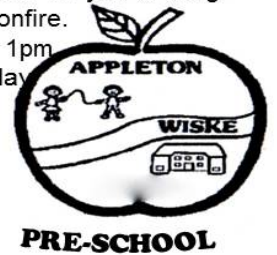

### DOG FOULING

This is a matter which seems to be on the increase again.

Two young members of our Parish, and responsible dog owners themselves, have taken it upon themselves to create the posters below and display them around the village.

The areas that are worst affected by this issue have also been reported to the Dog Warden.

The law relating to this matter has been published in the newsletter time and time again and there seems little point in repeating it but if anyone does witness a dog owner failing to pick up please contact Dog Warden "Dave" on 01609 779977 and ask for the Dog Warden. Photographic evidence is not required, but helpful, it just needs someone who is prepared to report it and make a statement to the Dog Warden.



## **Neighbourhood Plan Result of Consultation on Housing Development**

Explanatory letters, site map and voting forms were sent out to every property in the Parish in mid-September. This was followed by an open question and answer session in the Village Hall on 27<sup>th</sup> September. 41 members of the public attended and all areas of the village were represented: Front Street, Baker Street, Hornby Road, Smithy Green, Prospect View, Hunters Ride and The Paddock. The process of selecting the two sites, with expertise from URS Planning Consultants, Hambleton DC and NYCC Highways was covered. The Neighbourhood Plan Team believe that they answered all questions which were asked and the original village questionnaire, the Housing Needs Analysis carried out in 2014 and the report from URS and its appendix were made available for viewing.

The envelopes with voting forms were opened on 6 October in the presence of our District Councillor, Steve Watson. 77 voting forms were returned, again from every part of the village, of which 6 expressed no opinion. Of the remainder, 55% were in favour of site A, Land East of Front Street and North of Hunters Ride, and 45% in favour of Site B, Land South of the Primary School.

It became clear during the consultation in the Village Hall that the possible off-street parking aspect of Site A had been misinterpreted by several residents. The idea is that any off-street parking would be accessed from Front Street only and there would be no new road link from Hunters Ride to Front Street. Preserving Hunters Ride as a cul-de-sac should limit any further development as NYCC Highways recommend about 50 dwellings as limit for a cul-de-sac.

It was also made clear during this consultation that the Neighbourhood Plan Team intend to develop a design brief for the landowner and developer. We will be asking for residents views on this.

Now that we have a chosen site, the next stage is to undertake a Strategic Environmental Analysis on the Neighbourhood Plan. This is a complex piece of work and the Team will need to seek expert advice on developing it. They are seeking for a meeting with HDC Planning in early November to decide on how best to proceed.

Once we have the SEA completed, we should be able to finalise the Neighbourhood Plan. There are then three further stages: consultation with all those bodies who may have an interest, submission for independent examination and finally the Yes/No referendum for the Parish, which will be carried out by Hambleton DC.

## APPLETON WISKE PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have had a busy start to the new school year. Our elections have taken place for School Council and we have appointed our new Playtime Friends and E-Safety Officers. This term we are having a big focus on Reading. We are running a school reading competition and have a book fair, visiting storyteller and reading information session for parents coming up before half term.

We are very pleased to announce that we have been awarded a Silver School's Games Award and that we have gained our Inclusion Quality Mark at the highest level.

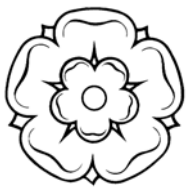
