## **Appleton Wiske Neighbourhood Planning Group**

Appleton Wiske Neighbourhood Planning Group have decided to suspend activities at present.

This is because we have four planning applications ongoing in the Village at present:

- 18 dwellings at the Shorthorn site (outline planning application approved for 11 dwellings but we understand that the developer may now propose 18)
- 5 dwellings at Village Farm (approved in outline)
- 3 dwellings for Mr Adams on Hornby Road (outline application submitted)
- 2 dwellings for Mrs Youll on Hornby Road (outline application submitted)

Assuming these all go ahead this would be 28 additional dwellings in the village, whereas the Neighbourhood Planning questionnaires indicated a requirement of about 10 dwellings. A recent review by Hambleton District Council has also indicated that there is no requirement for affordable housing in Appleton Wiske.

As a Neighbourhood Plan must include a spatial element, i.e. housing or other development, and we therefore feel we have no option but to suspend our activities. We will keep an eye on the planning applications in case there is any substantial change.

## Village Parking

Pavement Parking has been a problem in the village for some time.

Causing an obstruction on the pavement can make it impossible for invalid vehicles, pushchairs and children walking to and from school to avoid having to walk

on the road. It has recently been reported that tickets have been issued for vehicles obstructing the pavement in Great Smeaton, a situation which could also arise in Appleton Wiske. Please avoid parking vehicles on the pavement and allow pedestrians and others to pass easily and potentially avoid having to pay a fine for having created a problem for other residents.

### **Yorkshire Water and Village Green**

In recent months, Yorkshire Water has undertaken work under the village green to repair sewer piping, where the access cover had overflowed and to deal with flooding due to leaking water pipes.

In carrying out this work, the Parish Council were advised by Yorkshire Water that they (Yorkshire Water) are not responsible for the water supply piping which leads from the main water pipe to the stop valve which controls the water supply into individual properties. This main supply pipes passes under the village green on the east side of Front Street, close to the edge of the footpath.

The Parish Council's has the legal responsibility is to protect the surface of the village green but has no responsibility for any services which pass under it.

The Parish Council has been advised that any problems with these "branch" pipes are the responsibility of the owner of the dwelling which is supplied with water in this way. Advice has been sought from the Yorkshire Local Council's Association on this matter which has confirmed that it is not the Parish Council's responsibility to meet the cost of this piping should it need repair or replacement.

Residents affected by Yorkshire Water's advice on this matter may wish to seek insurance against any fault occurring. If you have any questions about who has responsibility for the piping then please contact Yorkshire Water.
